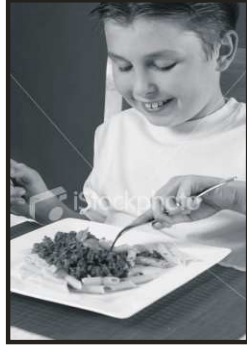

## Food Bank Demand Up 40%

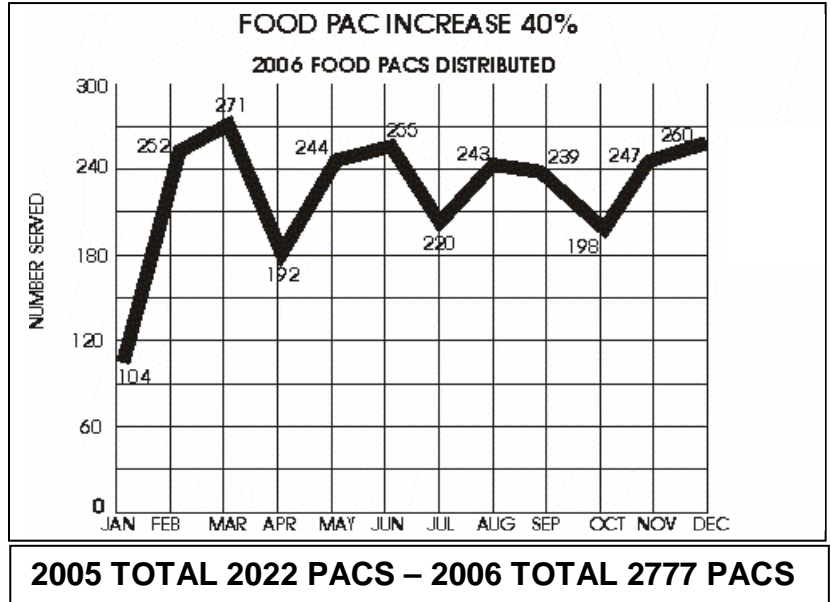
The Mission Food Bank distributed 2022 food pacs in 2005. In 2006 we experienced a 40% increase in demand distributing 2777 Food pacs.

With the increasing unemployment rates we anticipate that this trend will continue.

The Mission's noon hour meal numbers also rose proportionally.

A group of men and women huddled together under the courtyard canopy seeking shelter from the cold. Their breath froze in the night air, creating a white cloud that drifted above their heads. The Sanctuary door opened early because it was a special night;



Christmas Eve. On this holiest of nights, when Mary and Joseph sought shelter, the Mission's doors opened to provide Sanctuary to the homeless. Staff welcomed nine people. Christmas greetings were

exchanged. The lights out at 11:30 rule was waived and staff served pizza that they bought with their own money.

A Christmas movie was shown. Every guest received a gift, a backpack containing toiletries, socks, gloves and candies.

To be homeless on Christmas night must surely be a very depressing feeling. But on this night smiles, laughter and good cheer were present; and so was the true meaning of Christmas.

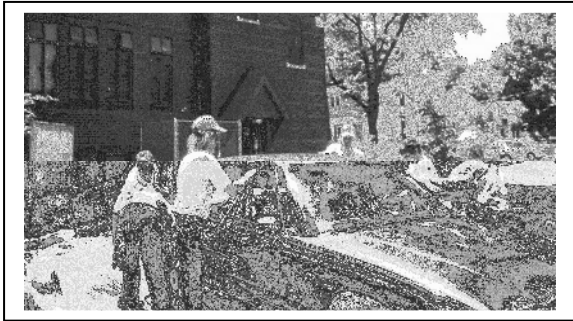
The Mission will also miss the contributions of Lolita Joyes, Bill Gallager and Barb Van Norman.

## Hearts That Light The Way

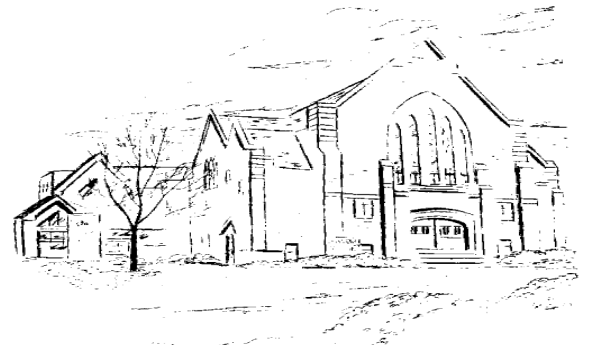
